Feed and water horses, maintain the facility in a manner of a well-kept farm, remove horse manure from paddocks, repair and maintain electric fencing, and provide ongoing landscape maintenance.

Hay and feed horses at 6:30 a.m. and 5:30 p.m.

Monitor and fill water troughs

Pick manure from paddocks and drag pastures

Trim and maintain farm landscape

Maintain electric fencing

Move/lead horses from pastures to paddocks and stalls
